In a nutshell, here's what to expect.

Friday Evening All-AoF Potluck.

Even if you are not a regular attendee of worship, you are a part of the AoF Community and at a potluck on Friday night (time TBD – at the Carmen Clark Lodge at 777 Westfall Road in Brighton), Ray Jones will be with us to help us begin to map out "What's Next for South." As we enter our second decade with the Acts of Faith, are we called to just keep doing what we're doing? ... add or subtract something? ... and how do we prepare for Pastor Deb's retirement in early 2025? Everyone's input is needed. Please plan on being there.

Saturday Afternoon at Third Presbyterian Church – 2 Events. Please consider the second for sure!

At **1PM** we will host a panel discussion with Ray and other members of those doing creative ministry in the Rochester area as well as a couple of our own members to discuss with other churches in the Presbytery (and beyond) what lies ahead and "How do We Get There?" Susan Orr, the Presbytery Leader and a member of our eWorship AoF will be the moderator of that discussion.

At **3PM** there will be **Presentations and Reception.** We are inviting our elected officials and other partners from the community to celebrate the many things we have accomplished. There will be a reception and all AoF's are asked to have a member of that AoF present, and a table presentation that describes their ministry and who they are.

Gala Weekend – Continued

On **Sunday, 1PM at Fellowship of Faith**, Rev. Ray and Pastor Deb will lead us in a **Communion Service of Dedication** as we head into the next phase of our faith journey together and dedicate ourselves as well as our new communion table. All are welcome to attend!

We are currently working on some of the details:

- Getting a secure transport for those who want to go from the Meadows to Third Presbyterian on Saturday afternoon
- Contacting our special VIP invitees
- Figuring out the role for the Deacons and the Session on those days
- Starting to create the printed program for those attending the events



We have already:

- Secured the Carmen Clark Lodge
- Secured the use of Third Presbyterian Church (who is graciously covering all of the building costs except the sexton's overtime)
- Secured a \$1,000 grant from the Presbytery to help pay for food and expenses related to Ray Jones' visit
- Secured lodging for Ray with the Sisters of St. Joseph on Gregory Street (they have housed our visitors many times in their convent a beautiful place with a gorgeous chapel)

There are many details for something like this. If you would like to volunteer to help with food, set-up, takedown, or greeting people and handing out the programs, please contact the office ASAP. Once Pastor Deb returns from vacation, there will only be three weeks before the event. We need to have as much done ahead of time as possible.

One More "New Thing"

We are all aware of how South has been redefining things for years – vibrant ministry without a church building – worship in non-traditional space at a non-traditional time – a Session that meets online with 2/5 of it being non-local and living out of state – inviting pledging and full participation across multiple locations – creating a new classification of membership (Constituent Member). But how do we grow or welcome new members of South Presbyterian Church when we don't all worship in the same place at the same time? ... when some people's whole experience and definition of church rests within one of the "other" AoF's?

One of the precepts of the AoF Model is that all Acts of Faith are equal and no one is more important that the others – not even Sunday worship. So how do we bring in and welcome new people who want to join us?

When someone wishes to join South as a full, voting member and claim our congregation as their Faith Community, they are invited to do so through learning about us through an Act of Faith and then answering the membership questions in front of the Session.

So far, we have had two active members join us this way. The Session pauses its business meeting and welcomes the new member in an online prayer service where the new person answers the membership questions. It is really inspiring for us all.

What's in a Logo?



Each of our Acts of Faith has a distinctive personality and purpose. These unique descriptors are easily visible in the logo used by that AoF. In fact, often groups find their own mission and purpose shaped by how they are represented graphically. The same can be said for our newest AoF, **Soul Sustainability** – the group that so many of you have generously supported with your contributions to get them launched and off the ground. Recently, the group unanimously approved its new logo – created by one of its members, Enuma Okafor.

Presbyterians are known as "the People of the Books." While that might often seem to be a reference to how much reading, education and studying we do, it's also a reference to the fact that we have two things that bring us to being Presbyterian – the Bible and the PC(USA) Constitution. Our constitution consists not only of rules and the polity that regulates our group experiences (the Book of Order) but also a historical compilation of what we have believed in various times and places (the Book of Confessions).
